And what kind of transportation would you use? A bike would be fine if you were going to your friend's house but your legs might get really tired if you are going across the province. An airplane is great if you are going a long distance but not if you are just headed to the next city. A car works in all sorts of situations until you want to cross the ocean and then, well, it would sink!

And what will you take with you? Should you take a suitcase to the mall? Should you pack a lunch to for a long airplane ride? Will you need your passport? Hmmm – all of these are good questions if we want to be prepared for whatever journey we are on, whether that's in our own neighbourhood or across the world.

One thing we know all of us should take with us wherever we go is the good news of Jesus. It should always be on our hearts to talk about Him because God has asked us to bless other people. And the best blessing we can give them is an understanding of Who God is and what He has done for us. Remember Abram? He's the guy in Genesis 12 who God told to leave his homeland and go to where God showed him. Why would God ask Abram to do that? Because God was going to make Abram into a huge nation of people who would bless other people. Hundreds of years after Abram, Jesus was born into Abram's family and provided a way for everyone on earth to know God! That's the blessing God was talking about!

And Jesus shared some important words with His disciples just before He went back to heaven. He told them to go and make disciples of every nation. Abram was told by God to go and then Jesus tells His disciples to go. I think it's safe to say that God wants us to 'go' because He's repeated it a few times in the Bible through important people.

Now you're thinking, "Well, I'm just a kid. I don't have any money. I don't make decisions for my life. I don't drive a car. How in the world can I go like God wants me to?". Those are good questions to ask! Here's another good question – did Jesus put an age limit on His command to go? Did he say only adults or only brown-eyed people or only left-handed people or only people over five feet tall should be the ones to go? Nope! He didn't put any restrictions on His command. He just told His disciples go and bless others by sharing their faith so people could become disciples too. That means all kids who know Jesus are supposed to go! Maybe you won't go to Bangkok or Vancouver but you can go to your school, your friend's house or the playground near your house. How far can you go to share God's blessing?
